

Stu Levy is an international entrepreneur, founder, CEO and Chief Creative Officer of the pioneering *manga* media company TOKYOPOP; Levy also produces, directs and writes graphic novels, film &television. Fluent in Japanese, Levy holds a Bachelor of Arts in Economics from UCLA and a Juris Doctor from Georgetown University Law Center. He studied at Tokyo University and Keio University in Japan and is a California attorney. Currently, Levy chairs the Producer Guild of America's International Committee and was previously a Board Member of its New Media Council.

At TOKYOPOP, Levy established *manga* as both the fastest-growing category in publishing and as an influential youth cultural trend in the North American market, releasing over 2000 manga graphic novels in

North America and Europe including Sailor Moon, Gundam, Death Note, and Fruits Basket.

As producer, Levy's projects span from popular Japanese anime on US television and DVD (including Initial D, Rave Master, and GTO) to live-action feature films (including major Hollywood production *Priest*).

Levy's creative endeavors range from writing books (novels and graphic novels including *Princess Ai*, co-created by Courtney Love and character design by Ai Yazawa), writing screenplays, and directing film& television (non-profit documentary feature film *Pray for Japan*, award-winning debut film *Van Von Hunter*, and 8-episode docu-reality series *America's Greatest Otaku*) as well as composing and producing music.
