In general, Museum internships are unpaid positions. Please note that we do not provide visa support. Candidates are required to commit to a minimum of eight weeks, and for at least two days per week, or the equivalent of fourteen hours per week. Evening availability once or twice a month for events may be requested.

About Asia Society Museum:

Asia Society Museum has earned international acclaim for organizing landmark exhibitions and publishing scholarly catalogues in the fields of traditional and contemporary Asian and Asian American art. The Asia Society Museum Collection comprises both traditional and contemporary Asian and Asian American art. The masterpiece-quality Mr. and Mrs. John D. Rockefeller 3rd Collection of traditional Asian art, bequeathed to Asia Society in 1979 after the death of Mr. Rockefeller, includes approximately 250 Asian artworks and artifacts from diverse nations—such as Pakistan, India, Bangladesh, Nepal, Myanmar, Thailand, Cambodia, Vietnam, Indonesia, China, Korea, and Japan—that date from the eleventh century BCE to the nineteenth century CE. The traditional collection also includes a number of objects bequeathed from the estate of Blanchette Hooker Rockefeller, acquisitions, and works from other collectors. The growing contemporary collection, initiated in 2007, features nearly 100 significant works of video, animation, photography, and new media art by artists from Asia and the Americas. Selected works from the Asia Society Museum Collection are loaned to and shown as part of special exhibitions throughout the world. Asia Society Museum has established the groundbreaking initiative Transfuze: The Asia Arts and Museum Network, the first offering of its kind, to connect museum professionals across the United States and Asia and build cultural exchange. Through exhibitions and related lectures, performances, symposia, and film presentations, Asia Society continues to demonstrate its leadership as a forum for the unique issues and viewpoints of Asian and Asian American arts and culture.

- Research and prepare artist biographies and object files for works included in temporary exhibitions and the permanent collection

- Fulfillment of rights & reproduction requests for our permanent collection
- Creating electronic folders for organization of publicationquality images on the cloud-based server

Collections & data management support

- Data management for our temporary exhibition databases
- Administrative support and general correspondence with lenders, constituents, etc.
- Scanning and naming primary acquisition and object information documents for contemporary art collection

Digital & media content support

- Drafting articles or blog posts
- Archiving and/or reformatting media assets
- Adapting content for print and other media into web content

Previous internship or work experience preferred; familiarity with art history, museum studies, and/or Asia through academic study and/or work experience; strong research, writing, and editing skills; excellent attention to detail; reliable and able to work under tight deadlines; proficiency with Microsoft Office, with knowledge of database programs a plus (Filemaker Pro, TMS, KE eMu, etc.); and flexibility with handling diverse tasks, including general office work.

Additional Desirable Education and Prior Experience:

- Proficiency in a Southeast Asian language, or familiarity with the arts of Southeast Asia an asset.
- Knowledge of histories of Buddhism, Hinduism, Confucianism, and/or Taoism is desirable
