Can you identify which exhibits represent the Royal status? Can you draw them out? Objects that are used by the Royal family Motifs that are used to represent the Royal status



In Chinese culture, the Chinese characters for "bat" and "good fortune and happiness" share the same pronunciation. Therefore, a "bat" symbolizes "good fortune and happiness". Can you identify the meaning of the bat motifs on the exhibits?

Let's draw bat motifs with following meanings...

A stream of good fortune fills the heavens	Happiness and longevity
Good fortune is in front of your eyes	Good fortune arrives at once



Representations of visual auspiciousness can be categorized into 3 methods

- 1. Directly applying Chinese words and phrases that carry auspicious meanings, such as shou (longevity), or four-characters phrases like jinyu mantang (hall full of gold and jade);
- 2. Applying traditional visual attributes (objects, figures, animals, or plants) as decorations;
 - 3. Utilizing the Chinese homophony, like "bat" which stands for fu (blessings).

Let's create your own auspicious symbol using one of the above methods.


