Interpersonal Communication

 Learners interact and negotiate meaning in spoken, signed, or written conversations to share information, reactions, feelings, and opinions

Interpretive Communication

 Learners understand, interpret, and analyze what is heard, read, or viewed on a variety of topics

Presentational Communication

 Learners present information, concepts, and ideas to inform, explain, persuade, and narrate on a variety of topics using appropriate media and adapting to various audiences of listeners, readers, or viewers

 Learners use the language to investigate,
 explain, and reflect on the relationship between
 the practices and perspectives of the cultures
 studied
- Relating Cultural Products to Perspectives:
 Learners use the language to investigate,
 explain, and reflect on the relationship between
 the products and perspectives of the cultures
 studied

Connections

- Making Connections: Learners build, reinforce, and expand their knowledge of other disciplines while using the language to develop critical thinking and to solve problems creatively.
- Acquiring Information and Diverse
 Perspectives: Learners access and evaluate
 information and diverse perspectives that are available through the language and its culture

Comparisons

Language Comparisons: Learners use the language to investigate, explain, and reflect on the nature of language through comparisons of the language studied and their own

Cultural Comparisons: Learners use the language to investigate, explain, and reflect on the concept of culture through comparisons of the cultures studied and their own

Communities

School and Global Communities: Learners use the language both within and beyond the classroom to interact and collaborate in their community and the globalized world

Lifelong Learning: Learners set goals and reflect on their progress in using languages for enjoyment, enrichment, and advancement
