Raymond Depardon chronicles the legal procedure involving patients forcefully admitted to a psychiatric hospital in Lyon, France. The title of the documentary refers to the number of days patients have to see a judge, to determine if they will be released. ★★★★★ JMa

Based on journalist David Sheff's memoir, Beautiful Boy: A Father's Journey Through His Son's Addiction, this biographical drama follows the struggles his family went through during his son's meth addiction. Haddonfield, Illinois, to complete the killing spree that began decades earlier. But this time, lone survivor Laurie Strode (Jamie Lee Curtis) is older, smarter and prepared for their final showdown. Directed by David Gordon Green. **** JMa

Hunter Killer (IIB)

An American submarine commander (Gerard Butler) assembles a crew to rescue the kidnapped Russian president following a coup put together by his defence minister. Also stars Gary Oldman and Zane Holtz. ★★★★ JMo

Lucid Dreams (IIB) (Cantonese & Mandarin)

Teddy Robin takes the helm in this omnibus thriller centring on four unrelated horror stories that are loosely based on his dreams. ★★★★★ EL

One Cut of the Dead (IIB) (Japanese) Comprising a 37-minute single take, Shinichiro Ueda's experimental comedy-
