PANFLISTS

MICHAEL E. FENG

Mr. Feng has built an important collection of early Chinese paintings, archaic Chinese bronzes and jades, and early 20th-century American vintage photography. He is a former Trustee of The Freer and Sackler Galleries and the Penn Museum, and is currently a Harvard Museum Collections Committee member. His collection has been exhibited over the years at the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Penn Museum, Middlebury College, and Oberlin College.

ANN R. KINNEY

Mrs. Kinney and her husband Gilbert H. Kinney have built a remarkable collection over the past several decades that includes works of ancient South and Southeast Asian and Himalayan art, as well as select pieces of Chinese contemporary art. She grew up in Japan, and lived in Vietnam and Indonesia, where her husband served as the American Consul in Surabaya, East Java.

JAMES J. LALLY

A prominent New York dealer and active participant in the Chinese art market for more than 35 years, Mr. Lally is the owner of J.J. Lally & Co. and former president of Sotheby's North America.

JOHN S. (JACK) WADSWORTH, JR.

Mr. Wadsworth is a long-time collector of contemporary art, including Asian contemporary, and a Trustee Emeritus of Asia Society. He recently donated an impressive collection of Japanese prints.

DR. JOHN C. WEBER

Dr. Weber is a renowned collector who helped form the important collection of ancient Chinese art at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. A former Trustee of Asia Society, he has built an impressive museum-quality collection of Japanese art over the last twenty years.

In and Out of Context: Asia Society Celebrates the Collections at 60

Through January 8, 2017

On the occasion of the 60th anniversary of the founding of Asia Society, the exhibition celebrates the legacy of collecting and exhibiting Asian art that John D. Rockefeller 3rd and Blanchette Hooker Rockefeller set in motion for Asia Society. The exhibition plays with the notion of context by juxtaposing historical and contemporary works to trigger distinctive ways of thinking about artworks and the people that produce them, both past and present. Kamakura: Realism and Spirituality in the Sculpture of Japan

With over thirty Kamakura period (1185–1333) masterpieces from museum and private collections in North America and Europe, this exhibition is the first to look beyond the aesthetics and technical achievements of these remarkable sculptures, and specifically examine the relationship between realism and the sacred empowerment of the objects.
