- 3 E's Evidence Based, Expertise Led and Engagement or Expose Driven.





 and other Lump Sums including that of Congress, the Judiciary and COMELEC
- Address the fall-out of the blanket accusation against NGOs' access to public funds
- Insulate emerging participatory budget mechanisms from patronage capture
 or syndicated corruption
- Move Open Data towards FOI (Users' Perspective and Demand Driven)
