We address various aspects of the overall issue of moving Chinese language programs forward, including general awareness, capacity building, making connections, and providing resources. Our work serves the general public, policymakers, educators, teachers, and students.

We are currently accepting applications for an intern position with a demonstrated interest in developing cultural and linguistic understanding between US and China.

This internship is **unpaid**.

Intern can expect to learn about the operations and culture of a prestigious non-profit organization as well as gain exposure to and experience in designing strategies for outreach, managing the logistics of an international program, and more.

Intern will be well guided to highly involve with the planning and execution process of a high-profile student fellowship program, which will be held in China in late July, as well as the 2018 National Chinese Language Conference (NCLC), which will be held in Salt Lake City, Utah from May 17-19.

Tasks may include, but are not limited to:

 - Providing administrative support for the Fellowship

 - Coordinating contents for the conference program book, mobile App and website





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- Assisting with content producing for the conference promotional materials
- Providing support for communication with conference presenters
- Assisting with travel logistics arrangement for high-caliber speakers

- Passion about introducing Chinese culture and society to Americans
- Exceptional communication skills, verbal and written
- Experience with Social Media and website management (preferred)
