Job Title: Young Leaders Institute Intern

Classification: Paid Internship Compensation: \$4,200/8 weeks

Schedule: Summer (June 2024 - August 2024 for 8-week period); 35 hours per week

ORGANIZATIONAL SUMMARY:

Asia Society Texas believes in the strength and beauty of diverse perspectives and people. As an educational institution, we advance cultural exchange by celebrating the vibrant diversity of Asia, inspiring empathy, and fostering a better understanding of our interconnected world. Spanning the fields of arts, business, culture, education, and policy, our programming is rooted in the educational and cultural development of our community — trusting in the power of art, dialogue, and ideas to combat bias and build a more inclusive society.

POSITION OVERVIEW:

Through support of the ExxonMobil Foundation Community Summer Jobs Program, the Young Leaders Institute Intern will involve youth and community engagement, programmatic research, and administrative duties. The intern will work with Asia Society staff in the Business & Policy program: Young Leaders Institute (YLI). YLI are summer sessions designed for high school students around global policy and leadership. There will be effective supervision through strong staff involvement and the intern will benefit from a team devoted to the intern's long-term future, developing their academic interests, strengthening their cultural fluency, and honing their professional skills.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Supporting Asia Society staff around the Young Leaders Institute for high school students.
- Conducting relevant policy and cultural research around global issues, with an emphasis on Japan's
 Global Impact, Renewable Energy & Climate Solutions, and Human Rights & International Security.
- Assisting in lesson plan development and interactive activities with a focus on professional development and leadership skills
- Providing administrative and logistical support in tracking camp students, parents, assignments, and more.
- Gathering and synthesizing feedback, and learning how to write evaluations and reports.
- Creating engaging leadership activities for small student groups, and brainstorming ideas to link summer learning with onsite exhibition or other Asia Society programs





• Liaising and communicating with Asia Society staff, volunteers, other interns, and students while honing professional skills.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Applicants must be a currently enrolled undergraduate student who will return to college full-time (minimum of 12 credits per semester) as a sophomore, junior, or senior student in the fall of 2024.

Interns who have participated in the ExxonMobil Foundation Community Summer Jobs Program in previous years may again seek an internship, provided they have not already completed an internship with Asia Society Texas. Family members of the board or staff from Asia Society Texas or ExxonMobil are not eligible.

Preferred qualifications include:

- Ability to communicate effectively with teens, and adults
- Experience or interest in global policy issues
- Experience, interest in, and ability to interact and engage with the public
- Familiarity and/or interest in cultural and current events in Asian countries
- Passion for supporting inclusive and accessible programs for all ages

PHYSICAL DEMANDS AND WORK ENVIRONMENT:

The physical demands and work environment characteristics described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this position. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable disabled people to perform the essential functions.

While performing the duties of this position, the employee is regularly required to sit; use hands to finger, handle, or feel; reach with hands and arms and talk or hear. The employee must occasionally lift and/or move up to 10 pounds, is occasionally required to stand and walk, and is occasionally exposed to wet and/or humid conditions and outside weather conditions.

The noise level in the work environment is usually moderate.

COMPENSATION:

The intern will be paid \$4,200 (four thousand two hundred dollars), which represents the total award from the ExxonMobil Foundation Community Summer Jobs Program. The amount will be paid bi-monthly for a total of four payments during the two months of service. Asia Society Texas does not provide compensation for interview travel or relocation expenses.
