REQUIREMENTS:

To be considered for the internship, you must:

- Maintain an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Major in international relations/studies, Asia and/or China studies; political science, English, history, communications, journalism, marketing, or another related subject.
- Be available to meet the time requirements (we work with each intern to develop their schedule based on coursework and availability).
- Commit to a period: 3 4 months and a minimum of 300 hours, or 15-30 hours per week.
- Internship is Unpaid. Course Credit is Optional.
