April at Asia Society Texas Center: Regional Premiere Spotlights Post-9/11 American Muslim Experiences in Ping Chong's Innovative Production Beyond Sacred: Voices of Muslim Identity



HOUSTON, TX — Asia Society Texas Center (ASTC) is pleased to welcome **Ping Chong + Company** to present the regional premiere of **Beyond Sacred: Voices of Muslim Identity** for two performances, April 5 and April 6.

Featuring five non-actors weaving together their own true stories into a powerful narrative, *Beyond Sacred* illuminates the daily experiences of young Muslim Americans who came of age in a post-9/11 society in NYC, and who are building their lives in a time of continued fear of and violence towards Muslims. *Beyond Sacred* was developed through a community-engaged process as part of Ping Chong + Company's *Undesirable Elements* series of oral history theater works exploring the effects of history, culture, and ethnicity on the lives of individuals in a community.



What: Super Sarap — NEW EXHIBITION

Artists Mik Gaspay, Jeanne F. Jalandoni, Charlene Tan, and O.M. France Viana revisit commonplace objects and food within Filipino cooking. Through sculpture, photography, and video, the artists elicit personal and collective memories and offer cultural connections that go beyond the Philippine diaspora.

The exhibition title, *Super Sarap*, fuses both English and Tagalog together, to hold multiple meanings. It can convey something that is extremely delicious, an expression of excitement and affirmation. It can also imply an exaggeration in terms of scale: something that is beyond, powerful, large, and exceeding the norm. In this exhibition, the artists play with these definitions and mutate symbols, making them both strange and familiar, challenging cultural norms associated with food.
