# Materials

- Container: use what you have available, the more room the less mess! You can even use a cardboard box or old dish pan.
- Filler: Paper shavings, rocks, grass, dirt, or sand. Feel free to get creative.
- Green and blue cardboard paper
- Rocks
- Flowers
- Leaves
- Marbles (optional)
- Animal print outs or toy animals – use animals that are found in Indonesia such as elephants, tigers, and the komodo dragon! Birds and bugs also work well (optional).

# Instructions

- Do some research on the environment of the animals that live in Indonesia. With these animals in mind, create a sensory bin for them to live in!
- Gather the materials together. First start by filling the container with your filler of choice. Dirt and sand are the best options, but green paper shavings or crumpled up paper also work!
- Use the rest of the materials to create a mini rainforest! Use blue paper or marbles to create a river or ocean. Use the leaves as trees, and the flowers to add color. Did you know that Indonesia is home to one of the biggest flowers in the world? It is called a rafflesia.
- Once you are done with your sensory bin print out some images of these unique animals and place them inside their new home!
- Don't forget to have fun and take pictures of your finished result!
