Indra Nooyi, Former PepsiCo Chairman and CEO, Opens Fifth Season of Bank of America Women's Leadership Series

HOUSTON, TX — Asia Society Texas Center (ASTC) launches the fifth season of its Bank of America Women's Leadership Series with an October 3 program featuring former PepsiCo chairman and CEO **Indra Nooyi**. One of *Time*'s 100 Most Influential People in The World in 2007 and 2008, Nooyi was also ranked the sixth most powerful woman in the world by *Fortune* magazine in 2010.

Besides driving PepsiCo's success for 24 years, Indra Nooyi was the chief architect of Performance with Purpose, PepsiCo's corporate responsibility pledge regarding healthy products, the environment, and their associates. In conversation with **Laura Arnold**, Co-chair of Arnold Ventures, Indra Nooyi discusses her career at the helm of one of the world's largest corporations, her experiences as a business leader, and her contributions in the business arena

What: Scraping the Sky: Photographys by Vicky Roy [CLOSES THIS MONTH]

This exhibition compares two bodies of work by **Vicky Roy**. Selected by the U.S.-based Maybach Foundation to photo-document the reconstruction of the World Trade Center in New York, Roy produced a body of photographs focused on the rebuilding in 2009. ASTC will mark the 10th anniversary of Roy's unique views of the city in recovery by featuring a selection of his photographs from the WTC site.





Roy has also spent extensive time in the Indian Himalayas, where he captured the natural beauty of the world's tallest mountain range as well as the people who inhabit "the roof of the world," notable for the range of architecture made with extremely limited raw materials. By featuring photographs from his Himalayan series alongside his New York works, this exhibition compares the vast range of human ingenuity put to the service of engineering and building feats in radically different environments.

To explore the broader contours of kabuki actor prints, Kōkei's work will be contextualized by actor prints by Sharaku, as well as two dozen additional works by contemporary Japanese and western

artists.
