Job Title: Performing Arts & Culture Intern

Classification: Unpaid Internship; course credit available

Schedule: Fall Semester (09-12 2022); up to 20 hours per week, some evenings and weekends required

ORGANIZATIONAL SUMMARY:

Asia Society Texas Center believes in the strength and beauty of diverse perspectives and people. POSITION OVERVIEW:

As a Performing Arts & Culture intern, you will be involved with programs that cover performing arts, films, music talks, festivals and more. This internship will require research and involvement in curating programming. The intern be guided through the logistics and technical processes of how these programs are produced with opportunities for student research and backstage involvement in program execution. The internship will also include professional training for working at a cultural non-profit organization.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Provide support for in-person program development and execution.
- Research topics and artists relevant to current or future possible performances and events.
- Draft program concepts, discussion questions, and program recaps.
- Provide administrative and logistical support.
- Perform outreach to program partners.
- Liaise with other departments as needed.
- Other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Current university student; interest or experience in performing arts, film, music, and/or festival logistics strongly encouraged.
- Strong written communication skills.
- Ability to work independently and on deadline.
- Familiarity with Asian performance/arts/culture preferred.
